The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord: The Anointing

The Liturgy last week revealed the mystery of God's plan—that in Jesus all peoples, symbolised by the Magi, have been made "co-heirs" to the blessings promised Israel. This week, we're shown how we claim our inheritance.

Jesus doesn't submit to John's baptism as a sinner in need of purification. He humbles Himself to pass through Jordan's waters in order to lead a new "exodus"—opening up the promised land of heaven so that all peoples can hear the words pronounced over Jesus today, words once reserved only for Israel and its king: that each of us is a beloved son or daughter of God (see Genesis 22:2; Exodus 4:22; Psalm 2:7).

Jesus is the chosen servant Isaiah prophesies in today's First Reading, anointed with the Spirit to make things right and just on earth. God puts His Spirit upon Jesus to make Him "a covenant of the people," the liberator of the captives, the light to the nations. Jesus, today's Second Reading tells us, is the One long expected in Israel, "anointed... with the Holy Spirit and power."

The word messiah means "one anointed" with God's Spirit. King David was "the anointed of the God of

Jacob" (see 2 Samuel 23:1–17; Psalm 18:51; 132:10, 17). The prophets taught Israel to await a royal offshoot of David, upon whom the Spirit would rest (see Isaiah 11:1–2; Daniel 9:25).

That's why the crowds are so anxious at the start of today's Gospel. But it isn't John they're looking for. God confirms with His own voice what the angel earlier told Mary: Jesus is the Son of the Most High, come to claim the throne of David forever (see Luke 1:32–33).

In the Baptism that He brings, the voice of God will hover over the waters as fiery flame, as we sing in today's Psalm. He has sanctified the waters, made them a passageway to healing and freedom—a fountain of new birth and everlasting life. (Scott Hahn)

Friday and Saturday Masses – Fr. Domenico is now offering Mass on Friday and Saturday mornings as well. This will begin on Friday 17 January, at 11.00am (Week 1 in Ordinary Time). See overleaf.

Pilgrimage to Northern Spain: September 2019 (dates to be confirmed) - Fr. Domenico is organising a 5-day pilgrimage, centred on the vibrant Catalan city of Barcelona. The highlight of the pilgrimage will be Mass celebrated in Gaudi's famous Sagrada Familia, followed by a full tour led by an English-speaking guide. As well as a city tour of Barcelona, we will also have a day trip to the spectacular mountain monastery of Montserrat, with Mass, tour, and an opportunity to see the famous Black Madonna. St. Ignatius of Loyola visited the monastery in 1522, for prayer and discernment after his conversion, before journeying to Manresa; we will follow in his footsteps and visit this town, which is a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Another day will be devoted to visiting the beautiful city of Tarragona. The price is expected to be approx. £900, dependant on flights, and includes half-board accommodation throughout our pilgrimage. If you are interested, please inform Fr. Domenico, in order to give him an idea of numbers.

Pilgrimage to the Oberammergau Passion Play, **20-27 July 2020** – Since 1634, the entire town of Oberammergau, in Bavaria (Southern Germany), has been involved in organising and performing a play re-enacting the passion and death of Christ. This Passion Play is mounted every ten years! Fr. Domenico has an option to take up to 33 pilgrims to this spectacular event, courtesy of McCabe Pilgrimages. We will be flying from Edinburgh to Munich, and staying across the border in the Austrian Tyrol, where we will spend five nights in a country hotel, between the villages of Lofer and St. Martin. The pilgrimage includes visits to churches and Marian shrines (Maria Kirchental), an opportunity to walk along the Jacobsweg (part of the Camino de Santiago), visits to Lake Achensee and Lake Pillersee, and a full day excursion, with guided tour, of the beautiful city of Salzburg. All this is a prelude to a two-night stay in Oberammergau, with guaranteed top grade tickets to the Passion Play, as well as lunch on the day of the performance. The price is £1,600 - this includes a return flight from Edinburgh to Munich, airport transfers, seven night's half-board accommodation, and a full excursion programme, with guides, together with the Oberammergau Passion Play ticket. **Brochures** and booking forms forthcoming. Again, please see Fr. Domenico if you

would like to register your interest for this pilgrimage.
