Solemnity of The Most Holy Trinity: Glorious Processions

In today's Liturgy we're swept through time in glorious procession—from before earth and sky were set in place to the coming of the Spirit upon the new creation, the Church.

We begin in the heart of the Trinity, as we listen to the testimony of Wisdom in today's First Reading. Eternally begotten, the first-born of God, He is poured forth from of old in the loving delight of the Father.

Through Him the heavens were established, the foundations of the earth fixed. From before the beginning, He was with the Father as His "Craftsman," the artisan by which all things were made. And He took special delight, He tells us, in the crowning glory of God's handiwork—the human race, the "sons of men."

In today's Psalm, He comes down from heaven, is made a little lower than the angels, comes among us as "the Son of Man" (see Hebrews 2:6–10).

All things are put under His feet so that He can restore to humanity the glory for which we were made from the beginning, the glory lost by sin. He tasted death that we might be raised to life in the Trinity, that His name might be made glorious over all the earth. Through the Son, we have gained grace and access in the Spirit to the Father, as Paul boasts in today's Second Reading (see Ephesians 2:18).

The Spirit, the Love of God, has been poured out into our hearts—a Spirit of adoption, making us children of the Father once more (see Romans 8:14–16). This is the Spirit that Jesus promises in today's Gospel.

His Spirit comes as divine gift and anointing (see 1 John 2:27), to guide us to all truth, to show us "the things that are coming," the things that were meant to be from before all ages—that we will find peace and union in God, we will share the life of the Trinity, we will dwell in God as He dwells in us (see John 14:23; 17:21). GENERAL NEWS

TODAY - Sunday 16 June: Mass at Scalan Seminary - this annual event at Scalan, near Tomintoul in the Braes of Glenlivet, takes place TODAY at 4.00 p.m. In previous years the Mass was always held on first Sunday in July. The reason for this change is that we are celebrating the 250th anniversary of the consecration of Bishop George Hay, which took place at Scalan, and in secret because of the Penal Laws, on Trinity Sunday 1769. Drivers: those driving from Inverness area are best to drive to Grantown on Spey and taking the A939 road to Tomintoul. Scalan is a short distance from Tomintoul, following the B9008 to Dufftown. Just beyond Auchnarrow, about five miles later, Scalan is signposted on the right on an unclassified but good road, with passing places, For those on satellite systems, AB37 9JS is a useful postcode. It should get you to Chapeltown of Glenlivet. After passing the Church of Our Lady, the whisky distillery and the water-bottling plant, all on your right, the road becomes a country track. Coaches have to stop here, but cars and minibuses can continue to within walking distance of the house. Sensible shoes are required, and one should be prepared for any weather. It is always a great gathering of pilgrims from across Scotland, and especially from the Aberdeen Diocese. All welcome. The Principal Celebrant and Homilist will be our own Bishop Hugh Gilbert, OSB.

Saturday 29 **June:** Stratherrick Day Recollection, for the Immaculate Heart of Mary a Day of Reflection and Prayer based on poetry and prose about Our Lady, with passages from: St. Luke, Blessed John Duns Scotus, Gerard Manley Hopkins, Thomas Merton, and George Mackay Brown. There will be a miscellany of words and music in the morning, with Mass before lunch in the church. Fr. Andrzej Niski will preside, with Deacon Dominic Nwaigwe as Homilist. After lunch, there will be a Rosary Walk to the Shrine of Our Lady of the Highlands, with Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, A Litany of Our Lady, Free Intercessory Prayers, Vespers, and Benediction. See the poster on the noticeboard.

Sunday 30 June: Annual Diocesan Pilgrimage to Pluscarden Abbey – Mass at 3.00pm (be seated by 2.30pm). This year marks the Year of the Catechist. The programme for the day is as follows:

1.00pm-2.30pm: Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

(Lady Chapel), **and Sacrament of Confessions** (St. Benedict's Retreat)

3.00pm: Pilgrimage Mass and Procession

(Solemnity of St. Peter and St. Paul).

There will be testimonies from catechists and pupils before the Mass, and the Diocesan children's schola will be singing, under the direction of John Horton.

Monday 1 July: Mass of Thanksgiving for Joyce Webster - Joyce has worked for the Diocese of Aberdeen for over twenty years, under three different bishops. To mark her retirement, at the beginning of July, and to thank her for her many years of faithful service, we are organising a Mass and buffet reception for her, with a number of special guests in attendance. The Mass will take place in St. Mary's Cathedral, in Huntly Street, Aberdeen, on Monday 1 July at 6.00pm. All welcome.
