Second Sunday of the Year: The Wedding Feast at Cana

This Sunday's Gospel presents the prodigious event that occurred at Cana, a village in Galilee, during a wedding feast also attended by Mary and Jesus, with his first disciples (cf. Jn 2:1-11). The Mother points out to her Son that the wine has run out, and, after responding that his hour had not yet come, Jesus nevertheless accepts her request and gives to the bride and groom the best wine of the entire feast. The Evangelist underlines that this was the first of the signs Jesus performed; it "manifested his glory; and his disciples believed in him" (v. 11).

Miracles, thus, are extraordinary signs that accompany the Good News and have the purpose of causing or strengthening faith in Jesus. In the miracle performed at Cana, we are able to glimpse an act of benevolence on the part of Jesus toward the bride and groom, a sign of God's blessing on the marriage. The love between a man and a woman is therefore a good path through which to live the Gospel, that is, to set out with joy on the path of holiness.

Yet the miracle at Cana does not pertain only to spouses. Every human person is called to encounter the Lord in his or her life. Christian faith is a gift which we receive in Baptism and which allows us to encounter God. Faith intersects times of joy and pain, of light and darkness, as in every authentic experience of love. The narrative of the wedding at Cana invites us to rediscover that Jesus does not present himself to us as a judge ready to condemn our faults, nor as a commander who imposes upon us to blindly follow his orders; he is manifest as Saviour of mankind, as brother, as our elder brother, Son of the Father: he presents himself as he who responds to the expectations and promises of joy that dwell in the heart of each one of us.

Thus we can ask ourselves: do I really know the Lord like this? Do I feel him close to me, to my life? Am I responding to him on the wavelength of that spousal love which he manifests each day to everyone, to every human being? It is about realizing that Jesus looks for us and invites us to make room in the inner reaches of our heart.

Pilgrimage to Northern Spain: 2-6 September 2019 – this is now FULL! Fr. Domenico is happy to take names for our reserve list, if anyone is still interested.

Pilgrimage to the Oberammergau Passion Play, **20-27 July 2020** – Since 1634, the entire town of Oberammergau, in Bavaria (Southern Germany), has been involved in organising and performing a play re-enacting the passion and death of Christ. This Passion Play is mounted every ten years! Fr. Domenico has an option to take up to 33 pilgrims to this spectacular event, courtesy of McCabe Pilgrimages. We will be flying from Edinburgh to Munich, and staying across the border in the Austrian Tyrol, where we will spend five nights in a country hotel, between the villages of Lofer and St. Martin. The pilgrimage includes visits to churches and Marian shrines (Maria Kirchental), an opportunity to walk along the Jacobsweg (part of the Camino de Santiago), visits to Lake Achensee and Lake Pillersee, and a full day excursion, with guided tour, of the beautiful city of Salzburg. All this is a prelude to a two-night stay in Oberammergau, with guaranteed top grade tickets to the Passion Play, as well as lunch on the day of the performance. The price is £1,600 – this includes a return flight from Edinburgh to Munich, airport transfers, seven night's half-board accommodation, and a full excursion programme, with guides, together with the Oberammergau

Passion Play tickets. Brochures and booking forms are forthcoming. Again, please see Fr. Domenico if you would like to register your interest for this pilgrimage.
