Sixth Sunday of Easter: The Beauty and Action of the Holy Spirit

"Our readings today are helping us to renew our relationship with the Holy Spirit. It is a very important relationship in our Christian lives [...] Because we all need to really experience that the Holy Spirit is real, that he is true and he is powerful. He is not just an "idea" or a feeling. The Holy Spirit is a Person. The third person of the Holy Trinity. The Holy Spirit is God. That's what Jesus is telling us today in our Gospel passage. He tells us that the Holy Spirit is our Advocate. The Spirit defends us and guides us and teaches us the true path for our lives.

Sometimes we need to reflect more on who we are — "children of God, beloved sons and daughters of God" —and on the value of our life and our Christian vocation. The Holy Spirit is the one who especially helps us to be aware of that. Our first reading gives us a picture of what the Sacrament of Confirmation looked like in the early Church. As we heard, the apostles prayed and laid hands on the people that St. Philip had baptised — and these people received the gift of the Holy Spirit. This is still happening in our times. The Church is still giving people this gift of the Holy Spirit in the Sacraments. So there is a perfect continuity between what happened in the early Church and what is happening today [...] and every time the Sacrament is celebrated. When we received the gift of

the Spirit, we received the gift of living with God — we have the living God dwelling with us and in us. Jesus says today: "Because I live ... you will live ... I am in my Father and you are in me, and I in you." We have a beautiful communion with God, through the gifts of His Holy Spirit. The Spirit lives in our hearts. And through the Spirit, we live in the heart of God.

St. Paul tells us in today's second reading: "Sanctify Christ as Lord in your hearts." That means we have to make Jesus the centre of our lives. We have to keep his commandments. As Jesus says in today's passage of the Gospel: "If you love me, you will keep my commandments and whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me."

Living the commandments, we will find the joy and love that God wants for all of us – the joy of the people of Samaria as the Acts of the Apostles tells us in our first reading. So let us always remember that in our Christian journey, we are never alone. God is always with us — he is always helping us.

This week, as we prepare for the solemnities of the Ascension and Pentecost in the next two weeks, let us ask for the grace to renew our devotion to the Holy Spirit. Let us ask him to renew his gifts within us. Let us ask him to inflame our hearts with love and to fill us with joy and peace." (Archbishop José Gomez)
