Twenty-Second Sunday in Ordinary Time: Pure Religion

Today's Gospel casts Jesus in a prophetic light as one having authority to interpret God's law. Jesus' quotation from Isaiah is ironic (see Isaiah 29:13). In observing the law, the Pharisees honour God by ensuring that nothing unclean passes their lips. In this, however, they've turned the law inside out, making it a matter of simply performing certain external actions.

The gift of the law, which we hear God giving to Israel in today's First Reading, is fulfilled in Jesus' Gospel, which shows us the law's true meaning and purpose (see Matthew 5:17). The law, fulfilled in the Gospel, is meant to form our hearts, to make us pure, able to live in the Lord's presence. The law was given that we might live and enter into the inheritance promised to us—the kingdom of God, eternal life.

Israel, by its observance of the law, was meant to be an example to surrounding nations. As James tells us in today's Second Reading, the Gospel was given to us that

we might have new birth by the Word of truth. By living the Word we've received, we're to be examples of God's wisdom to those around us, the "first fruits" of a new humanity.

This means we must be "doers" of the Word, not merely hearers of it. As we sing in today's Psalm and hear again in our Second Reading, we must work for justice, taking care of our brothers and sisters and living by the truth God has placed in our hearts.

The Word given to us is a perfect gift. We should not add to it through vain and needless devotions. Nor should we subtract from it by picking and choosing which of His laws to honour. "Hear me," Jesus says in today's Gospel. Today, we're called to examine our relationship to God's law. Is the practice of our religion a pure listening to Jesus, a humble welcoming of the Word planted in us and able to save our souls? Or are we only paying lip service? (Scott Hahn)

From NEXT SUNDAY, 5 SEPTEMBER, there will be NO online booking. Everyone is free to come along to St. Columba's, and to sit where they wish!

- Your name will be written down by one of our stewards when you enter the church, for track and trace purposes.
- Although social distancing is no longer required, we will continue with the current two-seat widths between different household groups please respect the space of others.

- Face coverings are mandatory, and must still be worn. Sanitising protocols will still be maintained.
- Holy Communion will remain under one kind only, and must be received in the hand.
- As you know, we are now permitted to sing at Mass, and hymn books and Sunday Missals can be used. They are located in the seats in front of you.

Fr. Domenico will continue to offer two Masses each Sunday: at 9.30am (which will also be livestreamed) and at 11.00am.

Altar Servers: happily, we are now permitted to have Altar Servers on the Sanctuary once again. Any child who has received First Holy Communion is encouraged to consider helping the Parish Liturgy by serving at Mass. It doesn't matter if you are a new Server, or if you are one of our 'old hands'; if you would like to assist during our Sunday Masses, just let us know. Full training will be given!
