Fifth Sunday of Easter: On the Vine

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells us that He is the true vine that God intended Israel to be—the source of divine life and wisdom for the nations (see Sirach 24:17–24).

In Baptism, each of us was joined to Him by the Holy Spirit. As a branch grows from a tree, our souls are to draw life from Him, nourished by His word and the Eucharist.

Paul in today's First Reading seeks to be grafted onto the visible expression of Christ the true vine— His Church. Once the chief persecutor of the Church, Paul encounters initial resistance and suspicion. But he is known by his fruits, by his powerful witness to the Lord working in his life (see Matthew 7:16–20).

We too are commanded today to bear good fruits as His disciples so that our lives give glory to God. Like Paul's life, our lives must bear witness to His goodness.

Jesus cautions us, however, that if we're bearing fruit, we can expect that God will "prune" us—as a gardener

trims and cuts back a plant so that it will grow stronger and bear even more fruit. He is teaching us today how to look at our sufferings and trials with the eyes of faith. We need to see our struggles as pruning, by which we are being disciplined and trained so that we can grow in holiness and bear fruits of righteousness (see Hebrews 12:4–11).

We need to always remain rooted in Him, as today's Second Reading tells us. We remain in Him by keeping His commandment of love, by pondering His words, letting them dwell richly in us (see Colossians 3:16), and by always seeking to do what pleases Him. In everything we must be guided by humility, remembering that apart from Him we can do nothing. As we sing in today's Psalm, we must fulfil our vows, turning to the Lord in worship, proclaiming his praises, until all families come to know His justice in their lives (Scott Hahn)

25-27 May 2021: Annual Pluscarden Lectures – the invited Speaker is Fr. Thomas White OP, of the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas in Rome. Fr. Thomas is

the Director of the Thomistic Institute, and Professor of Systematic Theology. He will be speaking on the Passion and Resurrection of Jesus (see the attached documentation). It is likely that the talks will be livestreamed.

May Rosary Mission 2021 – All of the dioceses throughout the UK are being invited to participate in praying the Rosary for the following special intentions: 1. Protecting our families and the family of nations, especially in this Year of St. Joseph; 2. A deepening of faith, hope and love and the protection of life; 3. Peace in the world; 4. Deliverance from Coronavirus; for those working for a cure; for those who have died; for those who are suffering and those who care for them.

During the Marian month of May, there will be three designated National Days of Prayer:

1. Monday May 24th – Feast of Mary, Mother of the Church – a Rosary Day of Prayer for our young people and for the Mission of our Schools, Youth Associations, our Young People and for Families.

2. Sunday May 30th – Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity – a National Rosary Relay Rally throughout the UK Dioceses. The designated Rosary Hour for the Diocese of Aberdeen is from 2pm to 3pm

3. **Monday May 31st – Feast of the Visitation** – Bishop John Keenan, of the Diocese of Paisley, will host a Crowning Rosary online at 8.00pm, in thanksgiving for the graces received from the Lord Jesus through the powerful intercession of Our Lady of the Rosary during the May 2021 Rosary Mission.

Mary's Meals: Pray in May – This May, the month traditionally dedicated to Our Lady, we invite you to join us in our prayer campaign for the work of Mary's Meals, which is reaching more than 1.8 million children with a nutritious meal in 19 countries every school day.
