### 'SCIAF Sunday': A Letter from Bishop Joseph Toal, Bishop President of SCIAF

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

On this 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of Lent (SCIAF Sunday) I write to you on behalf of the Bishops of Scotland to thank you for your generous and loving support of SCIAF – our Scottish Catholic International Aid Fund.

In today's Gospel we hear how the Father "was moved with pity. He ran to the boy, clasped him in his arms and kissed him tenderly." Despite his sinfulness the father forgives his son and loves him without reserve, restoring his dignity and sense of worth.

We too are sinners and, despite this, we too are touched by the grace and mercy of our Father. Broken as we are, our relationship with God and the experience of his unconditional love and acceptance inspires us to love one another, particularly those who are poorest and most marginal among us. Through SCIAF we can give thanks and glory to God by returning that love and mercy to those in need with joy and gladness in our hearts.

In this Jubilee Year of Mercy the Church throws open its doors to the mercy of God and encouragers us to accept God's mercy, especially in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Pope Francis asks that all Catholics show the same mercy and generosity of spirit to others.

SCIAF is mercy in action. Through our solidarity with the poor and vulnerable we all learn to see Jesus, "the face of the Father's mercy" in each other. In Ethiopia, SCIAF works with communities, driven into poverty and desperation by drought. This Lent, they share the story of Carfi Sara who speaks of how he was once "paralysed by

poverty" but how SCIAF's support has restored his sense of dignity by enabling him to provide for his family.

We can take inspiration from Carfi's message to the people of Scotland: "Your kindness has transformed my life, but I am just one man. Many more families are living in poverty. When they ask me, I give to the poor. Please do the same. Together, we can make people strong."

SCIAF's mission has always been to reach out to the most vulnerable of our global neighbours in a way that respects their dignity; giving people a hand up to help them flourish and working alongside them to tackle the causes of poverty and injustice.

This Lent, we have a fantastic opportunity to help many more families like Carfi's. For the second year in a row, every penny you put into a WEE BOX or collection plate for SCIAF will be doubled by the UK government. To qualify, our donations must reach SCIAF by 4<sup>th</sup> May so please remember to count up your coins and send in the funds as soon as you can.

SCIAF is a testament to faith. Our thoughts and prayers bring people hope and encouragement to those in desperate need, providing comfort in the knowledge that they are not forgotten. But by living our faith in this way, our own lives are also enriched. I urge you this Lent, in your prayers and in your actions, to commit yourself once again to the work of SCIAF. Let us share what we have gratefully received with our brothers and sisters around the world, bringing wholeness and dignity to those left paralysed by poverty.

### **Inter-Diocesan World Youth Day Gathering:**

The Inter Diocesan WYD 2016 Palm Sunday Mass will be held on 20th March at 1.00pm in St Mary's Cathedral, Aberdeen. Young People from all over Scotland will be gathering in Aberdeen.
