Why do we venerate relics?

"So completely do the saints correspond to God's grace that – for a millennium and more after their bodies have lain lifeless – their very bones remain a channel of grace. Long before the coming of Christ, the prophet Ezechiel beheld a vision of a field of dry bones, and the Lord God said to the bones: "Behold, I will cause breath to enter you, and you shall live" (Ez 37:5). The Lord God breathed on the bones, and indeed they returned to life. Yet the breath of God accomplishes still more than that. It renders the bones of his chosen people not only *living*, but truly *life-giving*..

By the time of Jesus, believers took the doctrine of relics for granted. In the Gospels we find a woman who "suffered from a haemorrhage for twelve years." Though she had given up on medical doctors, she knew that she could trust in the touch of something that had touched the sacred. As Jesus passed by, she said to herself, "If I only touch his garment, I shall be made well" (Mt 9:20-21). And she was made well. Before Jesus ascended to heaven, he breathed upon the Church (Jn 20:22) and imparted his life-giving

Spirit. Thereby his healing ministry passed to the saints; and the New Testament shows them busy about it.. Decades passed, and still "God did extraordinary miracles by the hands of Paul, so that handkerchiefs or aprons were carried away from his body to the sick, and diseases left them and the evil spirits came out of them" (Acts 19:11-12).

Is it any wonder that the early Christians continued to place great trust in the relics of the saints? Archaeologists have turned up ample evidence of this devotion, dating back to the deaths of Saints Peter and Paul in Rome. The faithful took care to preserve their remains, and pilgrims streamed to the city to venerate them and touch them... Christians believed in the marvellous exchange: Christ became what we are so that we might become what he is. He came to divinize us, body and soul and flesh and bones and blood. So the bodies of the saints now convey his life to the world. As it was in the ancient Church, so it remains today: to venerate relics is something distinctly and characteristically Christian."
