The Spirituality of Mother Teresa

"Holiness does not consist in doing extraordinary things. It consists in accepting, with a smile, what Jesus sends us. It consists in accepting and following the will of God."

- Do you make time to listen to the voice of God in your daily life?

"We have the specific task of giving material and spiritual help to the poorest of the poor, not only the ones in the slums but those who live in any corner of the world as well. To do this, we make ourselves live the love of God in prayer and in our work, through a life characterised by the simplicity and humility of the Gospel. We do this by loving Jesus in the bread of the Eucharist, and loving and serving him hidden under the painful guise of the poorest of the poor, whether their poverty is material poverty or a spiritual one. We do this by recognising in them (and giving back to them) the image and likeness of God."
